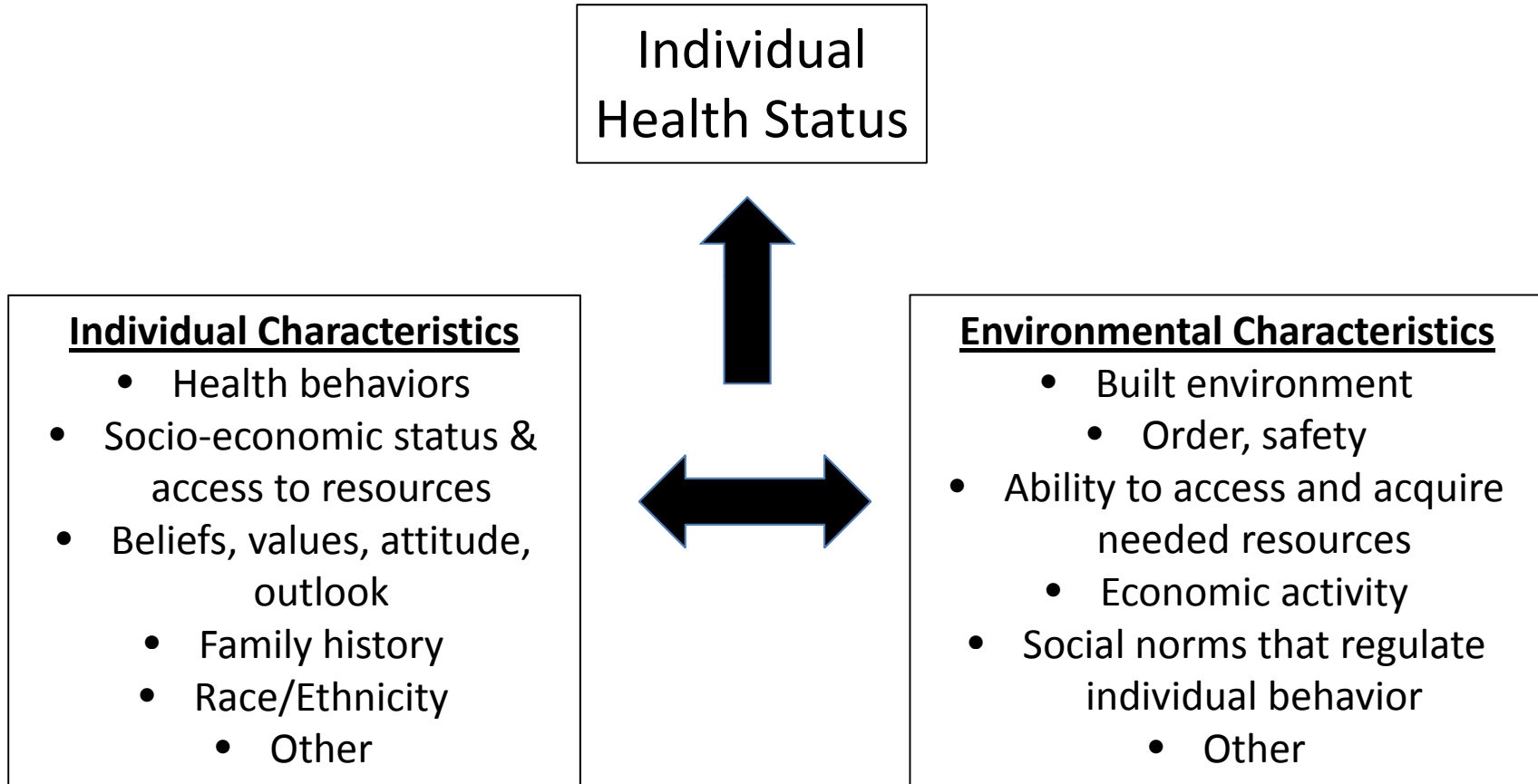

- Identify specific groups within these communities experiencing health disparities
- Identify contributing factors that create both barriers and opportunities for these populations to live healthier lives

Organizing Framework



Data Selection Criteria

- Reliable/Credible
- Consistent over time
- Stable definitions/constructs
- Granular (minimum level: ZIP), able to show differences across County


Study Area and Unit of Analysis

- Sacramento County
 - ZIP Code

Thus far....data collected

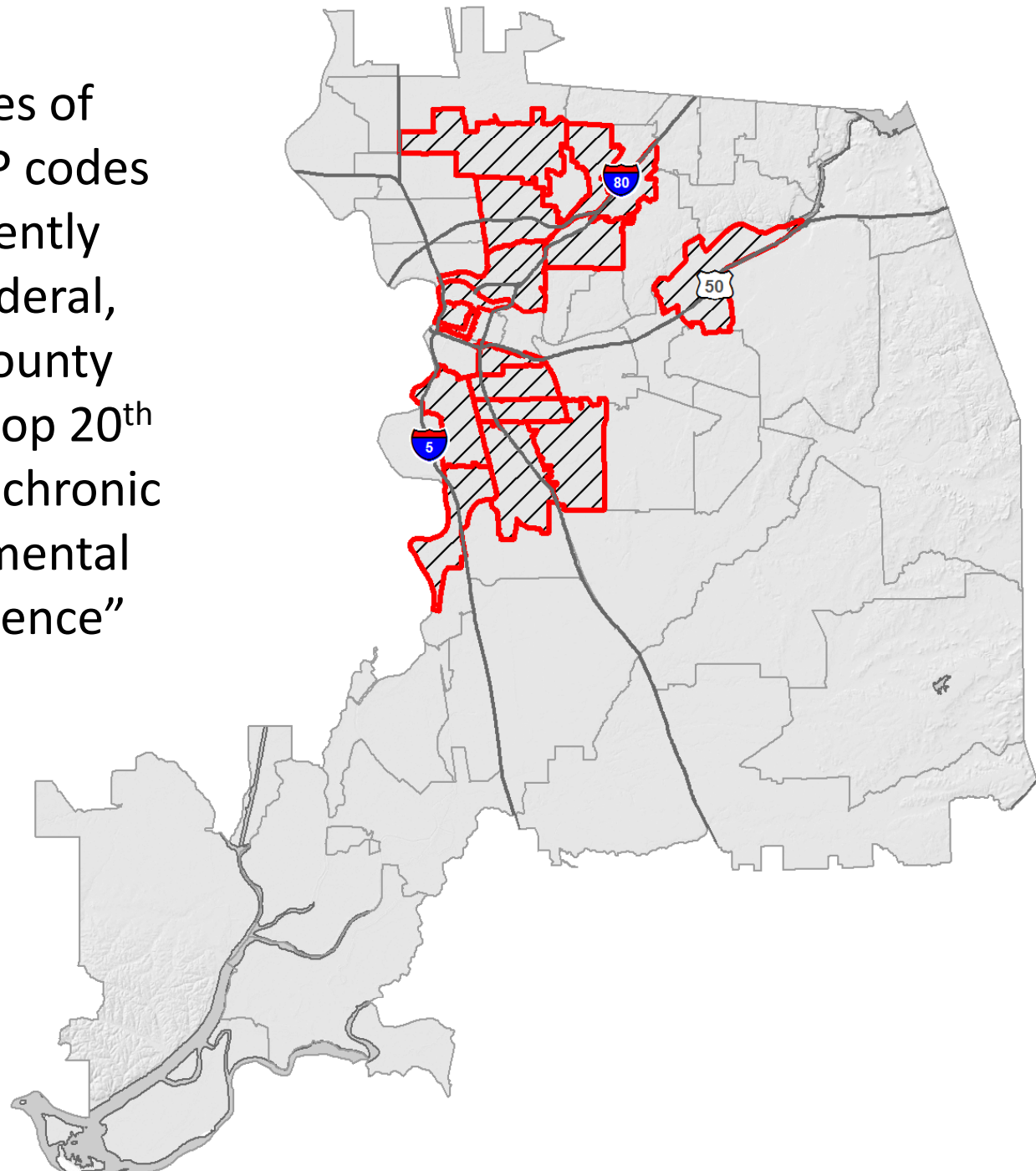
- Secondary Data
 - Demographic characteristics
 - Prevalence of chronic disease and mental health
 - Healthy Eating/Active Living
 - Clinical Preventative and Other Services
 - Tobacco Free Living
 - Social and Emotional Well-Being
 - Healthy and Safe Environment
- Primary Data
 - HSC meeting
 - ~40 Key Informant Interviews
 - 10 focus groups of 10-20 participants each

Research Question	In which communities do we see disproportionate rates of chronic disease?	What subgroups in the communities of focus are disproportionately represented in the chronic disease rates?	What are the behaviors specific to alcohol, tobacco, diet, and physical activity do we see in these communities that contribute to these outcomes?	What are the attributes of the physical environment in these communities that contribute to these outcomes?	What assets are available to the community to address the needs of communities of focus and subgroups within these communities?

Communities of Concern – “ZIP codes that consistently exceeded Federal, State, and County Benchmarks (top 20th percentile) for chronic disease and mental health prevalence”



Populations of Concern (within these communities)

- In order:
 - African American
 - Caucasian or White
 - Hispanic/Latino
 - Recent Immigrants
