2013 Responsive Grants Program Awards – Round One

Alternatives to Violence

Rural: Tehama

\$15,000 – Domestic Violence

To improve quality of life for women and children escaping domestic violence through the purchase of beds, other furnishings and equipment for the Domestic Violence Emergency Shelter.

Amador-Tuolumne Community Action Agency

Rural: Tuolumne

\$15,000 – Nutrition

To improve food security and provide nutrition for low-income and chronically disabled residents through services provided by the local food bank.

City of Waterford

Rural: Stanislaus

\$9,600 – Nutrition

To start a downtown farmer's market within walking distance of the city's low-income neighborhoods and to support market promotion and outreach.

Community Partnership for Families of San Joaquin

Urban: San Joaquin

\$15,000 – Adolescent Health

To enable youth at risk of or currently engaged in the juvenile justice systems to participate in Empowering Teens, a program of community organizing for social change.

Francis House of Sacramento

Urban: Sacramento

\$15,000 – Employment Skills

To improve the employment readiness of clients by expanding and enhancing the job development center with new programs, computers, training and resources.

The Friendship Club

Rural: Nevada

\$15,000 – Overall Health and Well-Being

To improve the health and well-being of at-risk adolescent girls by building program capacity to strengthen connections to community resources and with participants' families.

Help Central, Inc.

Urban and Rural: Butte

\$14,998 – Access to Health Services

To prevent injury and death resulting from binge drinking among local college students by improving access to free and low-cost health and human services through 211 and social media.

ISOT, Inc./Canby Family Practice Clinic

Rural: Modoc, Lassen

\$15,000 – Chronic Diseases

To improve self-management and care plan compliance for patients with chronic disease by developing best practices in launching and utilizing patient portals.

Klamath National Forest

Rural: Siskiyou

\$3,000 – Employment Skills

To support local underserved youth in gaining job skills and experience in natural resource careers through an eight-week Youth Conservation Corps (YCC) crew program.

Mountain Circle

Rural: Lassen

\$15,000 – Violence Prevention

To reduce child neglect and abuse by providing intensive, in-home crisis intervention, counseling and life-skills education for families who have children at imminent risk.

North Sacramento Grandparents Support Group

Urban: Sacramento

\$15,000 – Injury Prevention

To prevent injury for seniors, including grandparents raising grandchildren, through evidence-based classes on fall prevention, fall risk factors and preventive exercises and strategies.

Northern California Children's Therapy Center

Rural: Yolo, Sacramento, Solano

\$15,000 – Access to Health Services

To improve health outcomes of children with special needs by providing free access to early intervention, specialized therapies and socialization for low-income, uninsured children.

Partners in Care of El Dorado County, Inc.

Urban and Rural: El Dorado

\$15,000 – Advanced Illness Management

To improve the well-being of people and their families living with serious life-threatening illness or later stage chronic illness by implementing appropriate, effective interventions.

Plumas-Sierra Literacy Corporation

Rural: Plumas

\$13,750 – Education

To support the education and life skills needs of reentry offenders and their families in Plumas County.

San Joaquin County Public Health Services

Rural: San Joaquin

\$15,000 – Chronic Diseases

To prevent and reduce the incidence of type 2 diabetes by training lay health educators in diabetes prevention, who will further train members of their communities.

Switch Community Out-Reach Association

Urban: Sacramento

\$15,000 – Access to Health Services

To eliminate health disparities among African American men through outreach and education activities at urban barbershops to promote public health awareness.

Turlock Family Network, Inc.

Urban and Rural: Stanislaus

\$15,000 – Access to Health Services

To address mental health issues and increase child safety through prenatal and postpartum education and other supports for underserved teenage girls and women.

Waking the Village

Urban and Rural: Sacramento

\$15,000 – Housing/Shelter

To provide housing that unifies child care, health and wellness services, education programs and parenting supports for Sacramento's homeless, pregnant or parenting youth and their children.
